RE: Application to Bankruptcy *Pro Bono* Program

Dear _____:

You have qualified under the Bankruptcy *Pro Bono* Program ("BPBP") to have an attorney represent you in an adversary proceeding in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Colorado. Attorneys handling cases for BPBP are volunteers. Generally, two attorneys are assigned to cases to work together as a team with a more experienced attorney mentoring a younger attorney. We are contacting attorneys regarding your case and will be in touch with you to advise you if we have been able to locate an attorney who is willing to meet with you to discuss your case. The final decision as to representation will be made at the time of the initial meeting with the designated attorney.

Locating an attorney to meet with you may take several weeks. There is no guaranty that we can find an attorney who would be willing to take your case. If there is a pending deadline in your adversary proceeding that may expire during this period, you should file a motion with the bankruptcy court requesting an extension of the deadline. You may want to point out in your motion for an extension of time that you have contacted BPBP and that your case is in the process of being assigned to an attorney. Attaching a copy of this letter to your motion would be an indication to the court that your case is being processed.
